





## **Benefits of Social Networking**

- Generates better ideas
  - Detailed neighborhood knowledge & fresh perspective
- Provides clear show of political support
  - Especially important for tough decisions (like bus lanes)
- Creates committed customers
  - People willing to help (maybe pick-up newspapers?)

Notice: They help reduce costs and improve service!

## What do organizations say?

**Attitude:** "Why would we buy something that lets passengers complain about our service?"

**Answer:** Complaints are good, they're suggestions

Added Work: "Responding will be too much work!"

**Answer:** Design efficient response processes

**Fear of Change:** Developing emotional connections with passengers is a huge and risky change ... especially in a conservative and political industry.

**Answer:** Not trying is more risky in the long term.
